The Coppell Alumnae Panhellenic Association (CAPA) is a non-profit, community organization. The main goals of this group are to extend the opportunities of sorority life and interpret the Greek system to the Coppell community. This is accomplished by performing valuable community services such as the awarding of scholarships, philanthropic projects, and Greek information programs to prospective college women.

This year we will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a female high school senior who will attend college full time this fall.

Criteria:

The Coppell Alumnae Panhellenic Association (CAPA) is seeking well-rounded graduating high school senior women (public or private high school) currently residing in the city of Coppell or within CISD Boundaries. Applicant must attend an accredited four-year university with National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) Sororities on campus in the academic year following her high school graduation.

The applicant will be evaluated on the following:

- > GPA
- > Test Scores (SAT/ACT)
- > Community & School Service
- > Community & School Leadership
- >Essay
- > Recommendations

Requirements:

Applicants should fill out the application (High School scholarship application is available on the CAPA website <u>www.coppellsororities.com</u>) and supply two letters of recommendation. These letters can come from high school counselors, major subject area teachers, or resource persons within the community. Please attach a copy of your application, most recent transcripts, and necessary information, including a headshot photo suitable for publishing, should be sent to the Scholarship Chairperson (address above) and must be postmarked by March 31, 2022. Note – we have now extended the postmark deadline to April 10, 2023.

The Scholarship Committee of the Coppell Alumnae Panhellenic Association will judge applicants. All applications and information will be kept confidential. Finalists may be asked to attend a personal interview.

All recipients must attend college within the ensuing year or forfeit the award. Scholarship Funds will be sent to the college once proof of registration is provided.
